There was reason to be optimistic about the Saints' newest gathering place, Far West, Missouri, in July 1838. The city was growing rapidly, the land seemed bountiful, and it was revealed that a short distance to the north lay Adam-ondi-Ahman, a place of great spiritual significance. Still, it must have been hard for the Saints not to think about what they had lost. They had been driven from Independence, the appointed center place of Zion, and the chances of returning anytime soon probably seemed slim [...] Some may have wondered, Is the kingdom of God really growing stronger, or is it getting weaker?

Yet the faithful didn't let questions like that stop them. Instead, they started building a new holy place, this time in Far West [...] The Saints learned that doing God's work doesn't mean you never fall; it means you “rise again.” And though you'll have to give up some things, those sacrifices will be sacred to God, even “more sacred ... than [your] increase”. *CFM-IF*
